
TO: Personnel Concerned



1. Without a doubt, Sgt Luse stands head and shoulders above Law Enforcement Specialists, not only in his grade, but above those with more time, experience and rank as well.
2. The accomplishments of Sgt Luse are too extensive and numerous to mention in their entirety, but warrant a quick overview. In March, 1983, he attended the Washington State Accident Investigation School and has specialized as an accident investigating patrolman ever since. In a relatively short career, Sgt Luse has investigated over 900 minor accidents, 103 injury accidents, 21 of which included fatalities, and 71 hit and run accidents. In addition, he has performed as an instructor and trained numerous squadron personnel in the scientific methods and techniques of accident investigation. Sgt Luse was better able to accomplish this training through the use of a "flight teaching manual" which he designed and wrote himself.
3. Sgt Luse has been very versatile in other areas of Law Enforcement. During the period of March 85 and June 86, he apprehended approximately 58 drunk drivers. Additionally, he has involved himself in the entire spectrum of police work from shopliftings to domestic disturbances, larcenies, drunk and disorderlies, and assaults both with and without weapons. These are just some of the areas of expertise that make him an asset to any law enforcement agency in the country.
4. The contributions of Sgt Luse to the operation of "D" Flight have been invaluable. As a street patrolman, he is a seasoned veteran who balances experiences, common sense, and presence of mind to equal plain old police savvy, when dealing with time critical situations.
5. After completion of Basic Training, Sgt Luse went on to Air Base Ground Defense (ABGD) Training at Camp Bullis, Lackland AFB, Texas, where he was selected as the "Honor Graduate" in January, 1985. Sgt Luse has also successfully completed the Non-Commissioned Officer (NCO) Preparatory Course.
6. Lastly, I would be remiss without saying that it has been a privilege and a pleasure to have had such a highly dedicated and loyal individual under my supervision.


